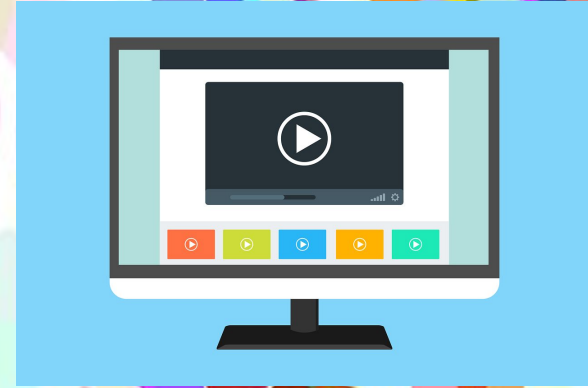

What is Edpuzzle?

- EDpuzzle is a teaching tool used to place interactive content into pre-existing videos from a variety of sources, such as TED or YouTube, or into videos you have made.
- Syncs with google classroom
- Features include trimming videos, adding voice-overs, embedding notes and questions into video
- Free account to teachers (limited amount of videos can be saved), subscription for unlimited available for purchase

Ways to Use Edpuzzle

- Show a video synchronously in class
- Assign a video for asynchronous work
- Measure comprehension of topic
- Integrate critical thinking questions
- Use for assessments/quizzes
- Use for lectures (can record voiceover)
- Trim long segments into smaller ones



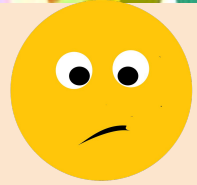
Benefits and Challenges of Edpuzzle

Benefits:



- Search for existing Videos from many channels such as youtube, ted talks, national geographic, etc. and edit questions to fit your needs
- Can view students' progress as they watch and answer ?s
- Multiple choice questions are graded by computer
- A lot of students know how to use it already!

Challenges:



- Takes some time to Upload and edit your own videos from your computer or drive (though it is possible)
- Takes some time to review existing videos and edit questions
- Open-ended questions take some time to grade
- Some videos blocked by filters


Why cut a video?
